JOB DESCRIPTION Bus Checkers

GENERAL RESPONSIBILITY:

The Bus Checker's help with transportation for Ar equipa Girl Scout Day Camp campers, Program Aides and some adults by checking the bus passengers on and off the bus safely and following all security measures.

AUTHORITY AND RESPONSIBILITY:

Position is accountable to the Transportation Coordinator for the quality of work produced. He or she will interact with the Bus Riders for turning in paper work.

SPECIFIC RESPONSIBILITIES:

- § Help make the pick-up/drop-off of all campers a smooth & easy and safe process
- § Help ensure the safety of bus passengers prior to boarding and disembarking the bus
- § If unable to fulfill the commitment made, either in full or for one of the days, responsible for contacting the transportation coor dinator
- § Plan to arrive at your bus stop at least 10-15 minutes before your scheduled bus arrival times
- § Hold up (or attach to your car antenna) the Girl Scout Trefoil sign you will be sent to help camper s/par ents find the bus stop
- § When campers arrive, make sure they have a **pink or blue** strip attached to their gear somewher e. This identifies the bus they will get on at camp also
- § On Monday morning, ask all camper s/par ents if the camper has any medications. Instruct them to go directly to the nurse when they arrive at camp to turn them in.
- § Turn in the check in sheet to the adult bus rider in the morning (from the day before). [Procedure: Each day, put the car bon paper between the two copies of the check-in/check- out sheet before you begin. You will give the top copy to the bus rider before the bus leaves in the morning, & the bottom copy is kept for use in the afternoon. Beginning Tuesday, turn in the completed bottom copy of the day before to the bus rider. Please send Friday's copy to Shar on Sagar, 92 Ridge Road, Fairfax, Ca 94930.]
- § Please do not call out the real names of the program aides or allow the younger campers to see their real names on the sheets. Keeping this secret about their real names is a tradition & we don't want to ruin it for them. Make a note of their camp names on the first day & try to remember them if possible.
- Make sure the campers and their gear get on the bus as quickly as possible, so the bus can stay on schedule. The bus needs to depart promptly to stay on schedule. If the scheduled departure time has passed & a camper (s) has not arrived DO NOT hold the bus. If a camper arrives late (& you are there) let them know where the next bus stop is located & encourage them to try to catch the bus there, otherwise they will need to drive the child to Camp Ar equipa.
- § The bus may possibly arrive late due to traffic, etc. [Procedure: Please stay until the bus arrives, tell all parents that they need to stay also. All parents are required to stay with their child & this policy is stated in their information packet.]
- § For the after noon drop off, all adults must show you their valid Driver's License & sign for their camper before leaving with them each day, no exceptions. You may begin this process before the bus arrives to expedite things, but it is imperative that you check to be sure that they are the approved per son to pick-up the camper. Some girls may have parental permission to walk home from the bus stop, which will be noted on the sign in/out sheet. In the event a child is not picked up within 10-15 minutes of the bus arriving you will need to take the child to your home & call the Transportation Coordinator who will call the parent & emergency number for that child. When the parent arrives they will need to pay you at a rate of \$25 per hour or portion of an hour that you have cared for their child. Please do not make the child feel guilty for the parent's mistake. And don't feel guilty asking for the money.

ESSENTIAL QUALIFICATIONS:

- § Ability to communicate with all types of people in a positive manner. Demonstrates a high level of quality communications at all levels of interaction with parents, campers and staff
- § Able to work independently, with some direction from others
- § Ability to instruct campers and Program Aides in safe practices on the bus

- § Shows good judgment
 § Willingness to uphold the ideals of Girl Scouting as they per tain to the Promise and Law
